Greetings Sisters and Brothers,

I recently attended a conference in Dubuque about the future of youth and young adult ministries. One aspect of concentration was intergenerational church. During one section, the focus was on how well different generations interact, accept and teach one another and how previous generations have influenced the next generations and vice versa. A few days later I ran across this poem about mothers and it reminded me of how much influence adults, particularly parents, but especially mothers have on the next generation. Since Mother's Day is just around the corner, I thought I would share a few of these "teachings."

She said: "If you don't stop crossing your eyes, they're going to freeze that way."

#### My Mother taught me about GENETICS.

She constantly said: "You are just like your father!"

#### My Mother taught me about my ANCESTRY.

She said: "Do you think you were born in a barn?"

#### My Mother taught me about the WISDOM OF AGE.

She said: "When you get to be my age, you will understand."

#### My Mother taught me about ANTICIPATION.

She said: "Just wait until your father gets home."

#### My Mother taught me about JUSTICE.

She said: "When you have kids, I hope they turn out just like you.

#### My Mother taught me about is REASONING:

She would say: "Just because I said so that's all the reason you need."

#### My mother taught me FORESIGHT:

"Make sure you wear clean underwear, in case you're in an accident."

#### My mother taught me IRONY:

"Keep laughing and I'll 'give' you something to cry about."

"It looks as if a tornado swept through your room."

There is a great deal of humor in this poem and it does raise the question, "What are we teaching our children today in this ever-changing world?" or more importantly, "Are we all teaching the love of Jesus, so our generations can stay connected to the future generations?" If the answer is yes, then we will pass along the knowledge and wisdom found in the love of Jesus Christ.

Sisters and Brothers, let us remember that our Loving, Teacher and Shepherd, Jesus Christ knows us all by name. "The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out" (John 10:2-3).

So here is the challenge I believe Jesus puts before us, learn the names of every child in your church and teach them your names. You see, if they know us, they will listen when we teach them about the most important name in all the world, Jesus Christ, and they will come to know him like he knows us. "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me—just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep" (John 10:14-15). If those we teach come to know Jesus like Jesus knows them, then we will all listen when the gate is opened, and we will all enter it with certainty and joy.
