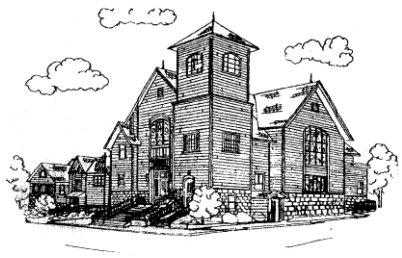

Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On December 1, 2013 Pope Francis said, "The time of Advent that we begin again today returns us to the horizon of hope, a hope that does not disappoint because it is founded on the Word of God. A hope that does not disappoint, simply because the Lord never disappoints! He is faithful!"

The birth Jesus Christ is what we as Christians celebrate at Christmas. The season of Advent is the time we honor the wait for Christ's birth. During this time, we remember the centuries of waiting that the Israelites endured, and quite frankly the whole world endured because it was this human and divine birth that would begin a revolution of faith. I say revolution because the word "revolution" has many meanings and those meanings were needed 2000 years ago and they are truly needed today. Revolution—a transformation, a upheaval, and a turning to a new direction. That is what happened when Jesus began his ministry. He transformed people from a distorted human life to the faithful life in God. To do this there was an upheaval of the distorted beliefs and a reordering of priorities. The first and primary order placed God back on the top where God belongs; and then placed the needs of the community and its people above the needs of the individual. When these events unfolded, the direction of the people became

God centered with Christ in the middle and all actions proceeded from him. The result was the formation and growth of a community of believers that truly changed the world they lived in. The direction of the new Christ driven community was recorded in the book of Acts.

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved. Acts 2:42-47

Does that sound like something we need today? If it does, then we need to be who we are, Christians and confront the powers of our culture and say, **"We are Christians!"** as we reclaim our Christian life by turning our backs on the activities that interfere with our worship of God and inhibit us from being the Christians that God wants us to be. We will pray for God's strength to fight worldly temptation and we will pray for

all those we need to love whether friend or foe because that is what Christ did. There is of course much more and that is why we must have open discussions in our community just as the early Christians did, just as Christ did. Brothers and sisters, we are due for a revolution, a Christian revolution that puts Christ at the center of our lives. This Advent season, let us prepare the **Way** for Christ by developing **Hope** in our lives and in the lives of others as we experience the **Great Joy** of becoming an active participant in Christ's faith in God so we can embrace the **Peace** that God gives through the promise of the baby we so anxiously await. So as we begin the Advent season, let us open our hearts to God and explore the possibilities of God's love together as we prepare to be revolutionized by Jesus Christ. See you in church!

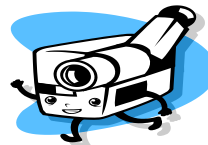

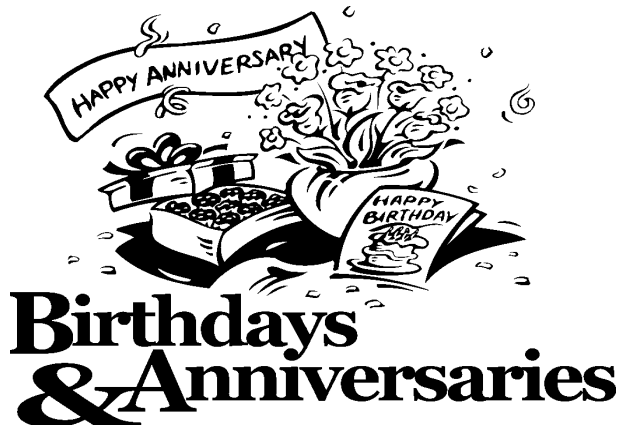

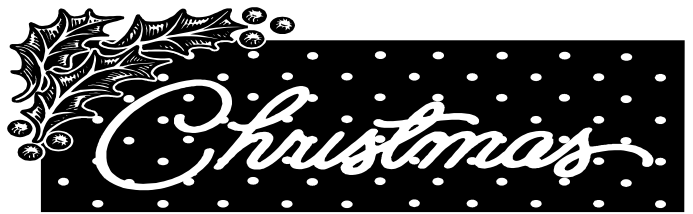
Next meeting Thursday, December 11 at 5:30 p.m. Meeting adjourned with a closing prayer by Pastor Steve.

Worship Service Cancellation Policy

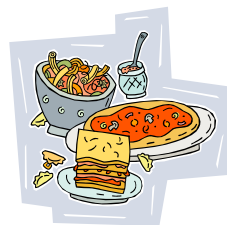
