

FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Spring is upon us, but not completely in the minds of many. We need a few more signs of Spring before we proclaim "Spring is here!" Some of those signs may be a warmer & more consistent temperature; more birds singing each morning; early spring flowers in bloom; green grass (without any snow on it); trees budding; and of course those familiar signs of Spring Cleaning.

What?! Spring cleaning! Oh yes, many of us have a yearly ritual called Spring Cleaning. It is that time when we look at our house and say, "What did I do all winter...look at the dust" and "where did all that stuff (junk) come from." May God guide us to choose wisely as we look at ourselves and our lives during our "Christian Spring Cleaning" this year.


