

Pastor's Annual Report



Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Zion Annual Report is an accumulation of snapshots. They are snapshots of events, changes, occurrences and facts which took place in our church over the past year. Now within these pages, we do our best to record what happened and hopefully what we felt as God moved through our community bringing hope and joy as well as helping us in times of trouble and sorrow. To express our feelings is something we often skate around in hopes of skipping the detail and simply stating the facts.

As your pastor, my hope is to teach you and make you aware of the feelings God has for you, the feelings God gives you, and the feelings we share as a community in and with Jesus Christ. God works in each and every one of us through the power of the Holy Spirit. This intent of God is certainly revealed by the words of Jesus, "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (John 17:20-21).

In Christ Jesus, we are one with each other, and no matter what happens on our journey together, whether we agree or disagree, whether we get mad or glad, whether we laugh or cry, we will know that God is here with us, and that we are to share love with one another as Jesus loves us. That means we will forgive and begin anew. We will put the needs of others ahead of our needs. We will be an active part of the body of Christ in every way possible so that we can continue the mission of God and the ministry of Jesus Christ. Therefore, we can say in full confidence, we are branches from the vine of Christ that produces good fruit, the fruit of the Spirit. We are a beacon that brings hope to those who are sick,

suffering or mourning. We chose to be last because Jesus teaches us, "Anyone who wants to be first must be the very last, and the servant of all" (Mark 9:35). We always forgive those who hurt us because Jesus forgave those who condemned him, those who beat him, those who crucified him saying, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34).

These are the words of Jesus Christ that should invoke the feelings of God in each one of us. So, before you begin to read these pages, I encourage you. Pray for God's guidance and love so that the feelings of 2016 become interwoven with the facts and reports of 2016 so God might help you experience this historical document to its fullest. Pray for God's comfort for our members whose loved ones have left us and now shine in glory with Jesus. Pray for guidance as we all begin a new year together so that our 2017 report will continue to be filled with God's love as we strive to share all things in community as God does, and may we all be stronger in our faith so that we may live the faithful life and strengthen our bond with God and with each other.

During the year 2016, Zion experienced the joy of 7 baptisms and heard comments on how wonderful it is to hear babies in church again. We confirmed 5 youth, received 3 new members by transfer and affirmation of faith, and we gave our blessing to 2 members who have found a church to worship God in the place they now live. We supported the families and friends of 7 members who passed into eternal life with Jesus.

As a community, we averaged 73 Christians each Sunday for our worship services as we sang favorite hymns, prayed, and learned how we can continue to be faithful apprentices in Christ. We saw lilies and poinsettias, stalactites and stalagmites, caves and plungers as well as balloons, rocks, ribbons, paintings, balls, fences, snakes, string, signs, cake, cookies, candy and anything else that might help us to understand our God—The Father, Jesus,

and Holy Spirit, our faith, and how we are can live the faithful life in Christ.

Zion had over 70 youth and adults participate in Vacation Bible School and we had 35 people walk, ride, bake or serve to help stomp our hunger for our annual "CROP WALK." 204 members, family, and visitors witnessed our youth retell the story of Jesus' birth and we held candles in the darkness as we sang and prayed with great thanksgiving on Christmas Eve. Before Confirmation in Spring, our class went down to the Ronald McDonald House to prepare a meal and to offer gifts in support of this mission of hope for patients and their families. In Fall, with the support of our Mission Committee, our new Confirmation Class built a house out of cardboard as a place to gather our gifts to support the Willis Dady Homeless Shelter in Cedar Rapids.

We saw 66 books of the Bible stacked up in church as a reminder to find time to read God's Word and we saw wagons going to and from the grocery store as our teachers taught us about giving to God by giving to others as they supported the Zion Food Pantry. We enjoyed "Grease," "Orphan Train" and "Mission in Liberia." We cooked food, served food, ate food and cleaned up. We tried some new things and we relied on some old. And this is just a brief recap of 2016 because there were many other things that we did with God's help, as a community of Jesus Christ at Zion United Church of Christ in Lowden, Iowa, USA, Earth.

What is so amazing is that God wants us to not only continue our journey faith in 2017, God wants us to take it up a notch and grow in both Word and Action as Christians. So, Sisters and Brothers in Christ, as we venture out, as we gather for worship, as we create new memories, let us pray that God will help us to feel God's presence and feel our presence together as we boldly go forth and proclaim our faith and live faithfully in the name of Jesus Christ.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the life of Zion, in the mission of God and in the ministry of Jesus Christ.

These are hard words to hear in the “earthly world” that often teaches us the opposite. Therefore, Sisters and Brothers, we come to church to be a part of God’s wonderful community. We come to learn the life of Jesus. We come to enjoy the life of Christ in a community that supports this cross we are to bear because we cannot bear it alone. We need God’s help and the help of our community. Let us make 2017 a year of growth and renewal as we take up our cross and follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Amen.
