What does being a Christian truly mean? It means that you believe that Jesus Christ, Son of Man and Son of God, is one person of the Triune God. Because you believe in Jesus Christ you participate in his faith in God and therefore you believe without doubt in God. It also means that your faith in Jesus Christ has transformed you into a Christian, a person who lives as Jesus commands. "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these" (Mark 12:29-31) and "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:34-35). Jesus taught us to first and always love God and each other. Now we all know these commandments, but where did we learn them? For most of us there are two primary answers, our family and our church.

Our parents and grandparents may have told you these commands right after they broke up a fight between you and your sister or brother. They may have read them to you when you said, "I hate that boy, he is mean!" They may have even reminded you of them when you got caught taking God's name in vain.

Our church also taught you these commandments. Most likely in Sunday School as a lesson or at ZYC when someone didn't treat another person as they would want to be treated. It certainly was in a sermon at least once (more likely many times). It may have been a pastor who reminded us after we said something about another person that was not in a Christian manner.

Now most of us know what is the most important thing we do in the life of our family. It may be sharing our love as we spend quality time with them, provide money to support the family, participate in the family reunion, come to a children's ball games, do the dishes after supper, mow the lawn, or one of many other activities family do together. So then, what about church?

What is the most important thing you do in the life of the church? Is it...attend worship services, give money to the church, participate in the Spring Dinner, come to Bible study, serve on a committee, serve as a worship leader, work on the landscape, or any of the other opportunities we as Christians have as we serve God? Is there one answer, two, or are all the answers equally important to the ministry of Jesus Christ. You see not all of us can do all the jobs, and because of that fact, each job is as important as the next because when you put them all together, they form the living body of Jesus. But there are some aspects of belonging to a church founded on the faith of Jesus Christ that are fundamental to the existence of the church and continuation of the mission of God.

For example, if no one came to church there would be no church, therefore attendance is paramount for the church to exist; and if no one gave generously to the church, the church would not be able to provide a place to gather nor the people to lead the ministry. These two primary actions as a Christian have been and always will be fundamental to the life of the church.

As we move into the fall season of our church life, let us all renew our commitment to Zion United Church of Christ. Let us make attending our worship services a priority in our lives and let us give generously so that, just as we were raised in the church and taught about the Triune God and the life of Jesus Christ, other will have the same opportunity we had. Let us participate in the life of Jesus

Christ as we participate in the life of His church and his body.

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (John 17:20-21).
